1)	Arbitration – Windlectric has been working with Loyalist Township staff on the Operations Plan and had gone through several iterations to meet Township requests. At the last council meeting the plan was not approved (it was deferred) and Windlectric was compelled to go into a binding arbitration (maximum of 90 days). Dialog is ongoing with the Township staff. 	oject activities continue north and south of Highway 33 on the ainland. Switchyard construction is making good progress on

the north side. Signs have been placed on the south side of Highway 33 to provide notice that construction will be occurring soon and access will be changing. Silt fences have been set up. A recreational road is being constructed by Windlectric on Loyalist Township property, at the request of the Township, to ensure public access to the parkland. Archeology work for the road is occurring and road construction will begin soon. Once the road is complete, the entrance on the west side will be closed off as requested by the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO). A small section of the mainland dock area will be fenced off for construction preparation.	
3) There has been a rumor within the last 24 hours that human remains were discovered during the archaeological work. This is incorrect. The archeologists have confirmed that there are no human remains (they were determined to be animal remains). Determining historical use of the property where the road to be located is the responsibility of the archeologist. Part of their process under regulation is to examine records, conduct field studies etc. There is no cemetery in the area of the road.	
4) There was a security incident where a Windlectric contract was threatened with a knife and security has been increased accordingly by Windlectric.	
5) Mainland dock – July 1st is the start date for in-water works.

Q. What will happen along Front Road, especially in the Village of

Stella?	
A. The Village of Stella will be impacted as little as possible. The activities are limited to major turbine component deliveries with each turbine requiring 10-11 trucks to transport all turbine components. Gravel trucks and other vehicles will take a different route.	
Q. Is there a restriction to time of day of the activities through Stella?	
A. Yes. The Traffic Management Plan outlines these protocols (e.g., avoiding component transport through Stella at peak ferry loading/unloading times).

Q1. The Community Benefit Agreement makes no provision for Windlectric to allocate any of the funds. What is the correct answer to the question at last month's meeting? "What is the donation?" Has the annual meeting with the Township required in the Community Benefits Agreement been held? Was the Township consulted concerning the "donations"	members.
A1. Addressed above under the "Donations – Update" section.	
Q2. It seems that anyone who asks a question to Windlectric is deleted from the Windlectric distribution list?	
A2. No, this does not occur.	
Q3. Why have all the stormwater management plans not been posted on the project website?	
A3. There are several written, any required to be made public have been made public.	
Q4. Windlectric, as the leaseholder, is accountable for compliance with all restrictions on the use of leased lands. Why was dumping of fill allowed by Windlectric on the Eves' property south of Front Road during the restricted period for grassland birds? Was this not leased property?	
A4. This question has been addressed. All work completed on the Eves' property and road was done in accordance with the restrictions.

Q5. What oversight is Windlectric providing on leased property to ensure compliance with all regulations and restrictions?	
A5. Oversight and monitoring is done by MOECC under the Renewable Energy Approval (REA). Part of the process is to be transparent with the ministries. Certain commitments are made under the REA permits, and in order to meet these commitments, consultants and monitors are in place to ensure all compliance measures are maintained.	
Q5.1. How do we know who is monitoring what and when?	
A5.1. Consultants and monitors are in place to ensure compliance is maintained. In the case of construction, there are outside organizations that are part of the process, but self-monitoring is included as well. Self-monitoring is being completed in accordance to the REA. An analogy was provided of driving a car and abiding by the rules of the law, you are not monitored by someone sitting beside you, but you must self-monitor your speed etc. to make sure you follow the rules.	
Q6. Mr. Sullivan told a resident that ads and mailouts were distributed for the proposed widening of the Highway 401 interchanges and intersection improvements. No notices are posted on the project website nor were they distributed to the CWG. Will you please provide a copy, advise the community, and extend the time for public comment by 30 days. Date of Ad? Date of mailout?	
A6. No conversation or discussion of this topic has ever taken place between Mr. Sullivan and a resident. All required consultations for activities have been undertaken. Windlectric is not intending to alter the public comment period. Requirements of the ministries are being followed.	
Q7. What is the status of the Roads Use Agreement with the County? We understand that there is an agreement but the county is still looking for the required appendices.	
A7. The agreement is ongoing. There are a couple of items, for instance the traffic management plan, that are being refined.	
Q8. Will Windlectric cease construction until the arbitration process is concluded and the company has submitted an Operations Plan

acceptable to the Township?	
A8. Construction will continue during arbitration.	
Q9. Will the access road to the Township park on Bath Road adjacent to the Invista property be constructed and opened to the public prior to the closure of the existing access?	
A9. Addressed above under the "Company Updates" section.	
Q10. Does Windlectric intend to fuel tugs and barges at the mainland dock in proximity to the municipal water intake?	
A10. Question posed previously. No.	
Q11. Does Windlectric's commitment to comply with all laws include the Noise By-law in Prince Edward County for the loading of aggregate at Picton Terminals? We understand that the early morning (3am) loading of the aggregate at Picton has upset many residents.	
A11. Prince Edward County is not part of the project location. Windlectric will comply with applicable laws.	
Q12. The drop box should be established by now. Suggestion: why not put it on the fence at the new ferry dock.	
A12. For safety purposes, pedestrian and vehicle traffic near the construction site needs to be limited. Additional information about the drop box provided above under the "Review of Agenda and Action Items from CWG #4" section.	
Q13. Water wells - Chatham-Kent has experienced problems with ground water contamination. Will all support columns, driven into the ground for construction purposes, be capped, preventing contamination of ground water? Will the MOECC be monitoring construction? Will a Loyalist Township building inspector be on site to assure compliance?	
A13. Windlectric can't comment on the project in Chatham-Kent. Windlectric is following all requirements under the REA for the Amherst Island Project. Details on the installation of the turbines is available in the REA documents and Operations Plan. Loyalist Township will decide whether/when to send building inspectors to the project site. The MOECC will decide whether/when to complete inspections.

Q14. What kind of jobs will be available to island residents? How many islanders are presently employed by Windlectric. Who are these people?	Pennecon the number of islanders employed.
A14. Due to privacy reasons, Windlectric cannot list those currently employed. The contractor, Pennecon, has hired residents from the general area. The number of islanders employed by Windlectric can be compiled.	
Q15. Suggestion: another Open Meeting to be held in September of early October. The community would like to hear from Jeff Norman. Jim Stewart and Homer Lansink.	
A15. The date for the next CLC meeting will be in September or October.	
Q16. Re: traffic. If there is to be an OPP presence on the island to monitor construction staff traffic speeds, who will be paying for this?	
A16. Generally, anything asked of the OPP that goes above and beyond their usual duties requires payment. Windlectric will pay for the OPP officer(s) if this is deemed to fall outside their usual duties.	
Q17. Re: Invista site. Is there an Aboriginal Monitor present during the archaeological assessment for the road construction?	
A17. Windlectric engages Aboriginal monitors as required by the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport. Aboriginal monitors are not required at this stage of the archaeological assessment.	
Q18. Who is paying for security?	
A18. Windlectric.	
Q19. What is the status of the forced road?	
A19. Legal surveys are currently taking place.
