	This item is an on-going issue and will be investigated continually. There is no action item update at this time.	
4)	Windlectric to communicate with Pennecon and the Island Store to determine if a standing order or other retail activity can be arranged to benefit both workers and the store.	
	The Island store is now supplying coffee and muffins to the work crews.	
5)	Windlectric to post meeting minutes on Project website.	
	Meeting minutes are posted to the website when they become available, on an ongoing basis.	
6)	CWG member to request that video be forwarded to Windlectric for further investigation (in relation to video recorded by resident showing traffic safety concerns).	Windlectric to follow up.

Comp	any Updates	
	Construction updates:	
1)	Turbine tower components have now arrived on the Island. The turbine towers were delivered by barge to the laydown areas on the island.	
2)	Road upgrades to 2 nd and 3 rd concession are now complete, remaining road upgrades are in progress.	
3)	The first turbine sections were erected January 29 th . The crane is situated at these locations.	
4)	Blades were moved on Saturday January 27 th . Collector lines are being installed.	
5)	1 km of transmission line is being installed, first pole has been installed (connecting the submarine cable to the above ground cable). The Transmission line is the only above ground cable.	
6)	Substation work is progressing.	
7)	An additional crew boat has been added with an allowance for up to 100 workers. This boat can handle more severe weather.	
8)	Winter weather (ice and windy conditions) and the impacts of the current flu season have impeded the pouring of concrete and other construction activities.

A.2. Windlectric has not been made aware of a timeline.	
Q.4. Could boring underneath the wells impact the groundwater?	
A.4. To alleviate any potential issues, directional boring is now being used. Boring is completed in stages at a specific depth. If anything is detected, boring is stopped.	
Q.17.1 What speeds are the trucks driving at?	
A.17.1 On the public roads, trucks abide by the posted speed limits and will typically drive at 15 km/hr.	
Q.17.2 Is dust an on-going issue, or has the issue only been raised since construction has started?	
A.17.2 Penecon has been in contact with the church to create a long-term solution.	
Q.18. Will construction activities ever occur outside of the allowable by-law times?	
A.18. No construction activities will take place outside of the 7am – 8 pm timeframe unless a by-law exemption is in place.

Q.29. Where does your permit limit begin?	
A.29. We are responsible for the turbine components once they arrive within the established Project area.	
CWG General Discussion and New Questions	
A number of questions were submitted to CWG members from the community:	
Q.1. What is the process to file a noise complaint?	
A.1. A noise complaint should be filed to the Township and to Algonquin Power via the Project email address.	
Q.2. Are there any noise by-law exemptions in place?	
A.2. These exemptions are in progress. The process is currently with the Township staff. The potential need for a noise by-law exemption was incorporated into the Operations Plan.	
Q.4. Once the turbines are operating, are you going to be monitoring the noise levels?	



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Item:	Action:
A.4. There are regulations and requirements in place to monitor the noise levels of operating turbines. Any complaints should be sent to the company and the MOECC.	
Q.5. Issue raised with the road closure on Saturday (January 27^{th}).	
A.5. The issue was examined by the company on Saturday, and will be remediated as required. A map was published to show this construction interference, and the company has recognized that the signage was placed slightly askew.	
Q.6. Has a log of available accommodations been created?	
A.6. Yes. Additionally, with the inclusion of the new boat, inclement weather is less likely to impede workers from leaving the island.
