Q.16. When your trucks see that someone is driving behind them and trying to get to the ferry, will they pull off to the side and let them by?	
A.16. Yes – construction vehicles will, when possible, allow vehicles to pass by safely to get to the ferry.	
CWG General Discussion and New Questions	
A number of questions were submitted to CWG members from the community:	
Q.1. The turbines are planned to be installed in the spring of 2018, but when will they be in operation?	
A.1. The turbines will be up and running in Q2 (April/May/June 2018).	
Q.2. Once the turbines are operating, are you going to be monitoring the noise levels? Where are the noise levels going to be monitored from?	
A.2. Specific details will be released in relation to the sensors and where they are suggested to be located, as recommended by the MOECC. Generally, monitoring stations will be placed in front of a reception point to ensure noise levels are within compliance.	
Q.3. There is a rumour that the fibre optic cable they are laying in the conduit will also be made available to the residents for high spend internet.	
A.3. The fiber optic cables running through the conduit are not capable to carry WiFi.
