CLC Discussion	
Windlectric provided the CLC members with a log of all questions received by the company from members of the public from July 10 th , 2018 through November 28 th , 2018. Q.1. Will the project continue over the winter months?	moving the posts.
A.1. Operations activities will continue over the winter months; a reduced amount of construction activities will occur; these activities will occur off public roads. Construction activity cleanup will occur in the spring, primarily being seeding activities.	(see question 3. In the Questions and Answers document).
Q.2. What will happen with the old O&M building?	
A.2. This is currently under review. There are no planned activities for the winter months.	
Q.3. How should community members contact representatives from Algonquin if they have questions?	
A.3. The project website, email address, and phone number will remain active. Questions can also be passed through Gerardo and Scott (Algonquin Power).	
Break – Q/A Period	
The facilitator invited meeting attendees to interact with the CLC members to ask their project related questions. The facilitator noted questions could also be written down on the Comment Forms provided, and placed in one of the comment boxes provided, handed to a CLC member, or mailed directly to the facilitator using a postage paid, self-addressed envelope.	
General Discussion	
Questions and comments submitted to the CLC during the break were addressed as follows:	



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Item:	Action Item(s):
Q.1. Question was raised regarding the paving of Stella 40-foot Road	
A.1. Windlectric will confirm if the road will be paved, and what the schedule is if this work is to be conducted.	
Q.2. Notice of this CLC meeting was not seen by community members, how was notice provided? The recorded meeting minutes are not uploaded to the project website in a timely manner, and the responses to submitted questions are not satisfactory.	
A.2. The notice of CLC meeting 4 was posted to the project website, included in the November 15 th and 17 th editions of the Kingston Whig and the Napanee Guide. The notice was also posted at the general store on the island. The meeting minutes and question response comments have been noted.	
Q. 3. With respect to the noise study, I suggest you speak directly with the residents who have concerns regarding noise issues to fully address their concerns. Many of the residents in the South Shore area of the Island feel that noise impacts on their homes are not being noted, as the monitoring locations are located along Stella 40-foot.	
A.3. The noise assessment is being conducted by a third-party, independent professional consultant. Algonquin believes that residences chosen for the noise study meet the requirements of the REA. If it is determined to be unsatisfactory this item will be revisited.	
Q.4. Regarding potential impacts from project related vibration to heritage homes, I suggest you follow-up with the concerned resident instead of stating that the vibration levels meet the regulations and guidelines.	
A.4. These matters are being addressed on a case-by-case basis. Jeff is in discussion with concerned residents.
